QUAITITY OF SEED TO AN ACRE. Many experiments have been made, both in this country and in Europe, to ascert in, with precision, the quantity of seed necessary to insure the greatest amount of produce from a given surface. It is true that circumstances will often render it quite necessary to vary the quantity, even upon the same soil; and in Great Britain, where the climate, soil and mode of cultivation differ greatly from ours, rules and usages have been introduced which are not practical with us. As a general thing, however, the allowance of seed there is far more liberal than in America. In the cultivation of wheat for instance, from three to four bushels of seed are allowed per acre. Six bushels of flax seed, and from three to four bushels or oats are sown, and so on through

A gentleman in the State of New Jersey, some years since, being desirous of ascertaining some facts relative to seeding land, instituted certain experiments which he detailed in a paper read at the winter meeting of the "Yates County Agricultural Society," and of which the follow ing is an abstract:

He sowed on the 23d of September 1846, four diagrams with wheat. The soil had been subjected to a summer fullow, and had been plowed five times during the summer. The ground was prepared for sowing by finely pulverizing it with a hoe and a rake. Four diagrams were then correctly nicesured off, each two feet square leaving a space of about six sinches between each. The squares were then num-bered and subdivided as follows: No. 1, in source 11 inches each way: No. 2. in squares of 3 inches; No. 3, in squares of 4 inches, and No. 4, in squares of 4 4 5 inches, including the outside lines of each large square. One kernel of wheat was then planted in the corner of each small

On the 19th July following, the pro duce was carefully gathered, the four par-allels being kept each by itself; the wheat was shelled by hand, and the number of grains in each parcel correctly counted and the results, were as given in the fol-

On the 17th of August, four ounces of this wheat were weighed accurately by scaled scales, and by counting all the grains, it was found that there were 780 garins in one ounce, from which an estimate of the different yield, and also the rate of the different amounts of seed per acre. The soil, in this case, was a clayey. loam which had never been manured, and had been kept for pasture during the six

preceding years.
It is very desirable that the exact quantity of seed necessary for an acre should be accurately ascertained; but this can be effected only by a series of enrefully managed experiments, for which practica men, with all the cares of a farm, can scarcely have the requisite time. Men of science, attached to our learned institutions, and those having professorships in our agricultural establishments, would do well to turn their attentions more directly to this subject.

CLEAN CELLARS.

One of the first duties of every house holder, at this season of the year, is to clean his cellar. Decaying apples, cabbages and roots of various sorts, old beef an I pork barrels, rotton boards and whatever else is subject to decomposition should be gathered up and carried into the open air, or put in a condition to produce no unpleasant effluvia. To sweep, dust and bedeck the parlors above, is not enough If there is corruption in the cellar, it will find its way among the carpets and rosewood of gilded mirrors in all the upper rooms, making the air offensive and un-wholesome. The occupants of a house are not so likely to notice these smells as their visitors.

Now, to avoid all this, begin the month of May by a thorough purification. Throw open the doors and windows of the cellar, and clear out all decaying matters. Sweet the floor and walls. Give the walls a good coat of whitewash; this will exterpate vermin, sweeten the air, and give the cellar a neat and tidy look, making it rival the parlor in its way. If provisions, or other substances liable to decay, have to be kept in the cellar during the Summer, chloride of lime should occasionally be sprinkled over the floor. Keep the windows open for a free circulation of air, -guarding them if necessary, by a wire netting.

GAME CHICKENS ..

Mr. C. N. Bement, a well-known agriculturist, writes: As layers and sitters, game hens have no superiors. Quiet on their eggs, regular in the hours of coming off and returning to their charge, and confident, from their fearless disposition, of repelling the incursions of any intender, cy rarely fail to bring off good broods Hatching accomplished, their merits appear in a still more conspicuous light — Ever on their guard, not even the shadow of a bird overhead, or the approach of a man or beast, but finds them ready to do battle for their offspring. The chickens feather rapidly, and, with ordinary care and a liberal and varied diet; such as chopped eggs, with a portion of onions, boiled Indian meal, bran and wheat screenings, with some new milk in the earlier stages of their growth, are reared with as little difficulty as those of other fowls.

A NOVEL IDEA. A gentleman in this city, who takes an occasional drive with his family, always goes provided with powder and ball to shoot his horse in the event of a runaway. This is a singular, but certainly a very wise, precaution. He got the idea from a gentleman residing a few miles out of New York, who driving home one. night last summer, with his wife and two children in the carriage, was placed in imminent danger by an unmanageable horse, which had taken fright at a lantern on the roadside. In attempting to hold the affrighted animal the lines broke and the horse dashed off at a break-neck speed. Fortunately the gentleman bethought himself of a revolver in his side pocket, and drawing it shot, the horse through the head. The animal staggered and fell. The occupants of the carriage were thrown out, but escaped without serious injury. -Lafayette Courier.
