

Capt. Henry Porter, son of Ex-Governor Porter, late first Lieutenant in the U. S. A., has been appointed by Secretary Stanton, and unanimously confirmed by the Senate, a Captain in the U. S. Army. Capt. Porter has been the Deputy Provost Marshal at Washington, until a few weeks ago and is now here awaiting orders from the War Department.

Captain John Wetzel.—We were honored with a visit from this gentleman, a few days since. He is a brother of our townman Samuel Wetzel and claims himself, the privileges of an old citizen of our good borough. Thirteen years ago Mr. Wetzel removed to Illinois, and settled permanently at Peoria. When the rebellion broke out, and the President issued his call for 750,000 men, Mr. Wetzel was among the first to respond, and as captain of his company, was stationed at Cairo. At the close of the three-months' campaign, he at once proffered his services for the war, was accepted, and went into the field as captain of company E, 8th Illinois. At the memorable battle of Fort Donelson, he distinguished himself for his coolness and bravery. During the fight, the 8th, after having been under the hottest fire for more than three hours, and their ammunition giving out, the Col. (Oglesby) ordered a retreat. While falling back slowly and in good order they encountered the 27th Kentucky (Union) regiment, who mistaking them for rebels, fired several volleys into them, and then fled precipitately. In their flight the panic struck on color-bearer, threw down his flag. In the meanwhile, the rebels, who had sallied from their intrenchments, saw the colors, and with yells of delight, ran to capture them. Capt. Wetzel and his orderly sergeant, left their company, ran back, saved the flag, and returned it to its owner, amid a perfect hail storm of bullets. On his return to his regiment, the captain was struck on the shoulder and knocked down by a grape shot. He received, however, no permanent injury. From continued exposure, his health has been so undermined, as to compel him very reluctantly, however, to offer his resignation. Mr. Wetzel is a gentleman and a soldier, whom we are proud to recognize as an old citizen of Cumberland County.

COURT PROCEEDINGS.—In the Common Pleas, the first week, after the usual number of petitions, &c., the first case was Geo. Mann vs. Jacob Eichenberger.—Action on Mechanic's Lien. Deft. plead that he held no property bound by the lien. Verdict for deft. Penrose and Hays for plff. Watts for deft.

Commonwealth vs. R. Oswald, A. Kaufman and Levi Eberly. Riot, Assault and Battery, and false imprisonment. This was the somewhat notorious "Secession Case." It seems that during the excitement, which prevailed all over the country during the early stages of the present rebellion, a committee of safety was formed in Mechanicsburg. This committee consisted of some twenty of the citizens of that place, about equally divided as to politics. A Mr. Kennedy, who is the prosecutor in this case, was arrested by some members of this committee, for publicly avowing sentiments which were exceedingly repugnant and distasteful to the loyal people of that patriotic town. Kennedy was escorted to the town hall, where a public meeting was convened. After hearing the case, he was refused to take the oath of allegiance, but refused, making some very ill-advised expressions. After some further deliberations, cooler counsels prevailed, and he was liberated, without injury or peril to life or limb.—This was the head and front of the offence.—Several months afterwards, some eleven members of this committee (all Republicans) were arrested. The Grand Jury ignored the bill against all but the three defendants above named. The jury returned a verdict of guilty upon one count—that of false imprisonment. Defendants' counsel moved an arrest of judgment, and the defendants entered into recognitions to appear and abide the result of the argument, which will be heard to day.
