The following Act has been passed by the Legislature and becomes a law:

**AN ACT**

To increase the pay of County Commissioners, County Auditors, Assessors, a Surveyors, Deputies, Jurors, Witnesses, in Cumberland County.

Sec. 1. Be it enacted, That from and after the passage of this act, the County Commissioners and County Auditors, Assessors, Surveyors, Deputies, Jurors, Witnesses, in Cumberland County, shall receive the following salaries for each day employed in the duties of their office:

Sec. 2. That the Assessors and Assistant Assessors in said county shall each be entitled to receive one dollar and fifty cents per day for each day employed in the duties of their office to be paid as now directed by law.

Sec. 3. That the Directors of said county shall be entitled to receive for their services fifty dollars per year instead of thirty as now directed by law.

Sec. 4. That the Jurors serving in the several courts of said county shall be entitled to receive one dollar and fifty cents per day with mileage as now directed by law.

Sec. 5. That the witnesses attending the several courts of said county shall each be entitled to receive seventy cents per day with mileage as now directed by law.
