"That the inspectors and judges shall meet at the place appointed for holding the elections of the district or which they respectively belong, before nine o'clock in the morning of the Second Tuesday in October, and each of said inspectors shall appoint one clerk, who shall be a qualified voter of said district.

"In case the person who shall have received the second highest number of votes for inspector shall not attend on the day of the election, then the person who shall have received the second highest number of votes at the inext preceding election, shall as inspector in his place. And in case the person who shall have received the highest number of votes for inspector shall not attend, the person elected judge shall appoint an inspector in his place; and in case the person elected judge shall not attend, then the inspector who received the highest number of votes shall appoint a judge in his place, or if any vacancy shall continue in the board of the space of one hour after the line fixed by law for the opening of the election, the qualified voters of the township, ward or district for which such officer shall ins pince, or I any vicency sind continue in the found for the space of one hour after the time fixed by law for the opening of the election, the qualified voters of the township, ward or district for which such officer shall have been elected, present at the place of election, shall elect one of their unmber to fill such vacancy.
