

PROCEEDINGS OF PROBATE MARSHAL'S OFFICE.—Since the promulgation of the order from the War Department, discontinuing drafting and recruiting, little or nothing has been done at the Provost Marshal's Office of this District. The Rebellion has accumulated the strong hearts and military genius of the loyal, and we are happy in the belief that the disagreeable duties incident to the examination and mustering of drafted men into the service, will never be resumed.

The following despatches have been received and disposed of since last report: The prisoners in the property in store at REANER KESSEY, Co., "P. M." 18th Panna. Cavalry, reported under the Provisional Proclamation.

On Tuesday morning the 25th inst., a man giving the name of JOHN SMITH, was brought into the office under charge of Detective E. P. ZINN. This was the individual who on the night previous created such an alarm by his represented nearness of resemblance to the assassin J. WILLIAM BOONER. The country near the residence of Mr. D. RAYBURN was thronged with people, all evincing a decided disposition to assist in the capture of said "Booner." But the latter, or rather his prototype, eluded the vigilance of his pursuers and made his escape to the neighborhood of Mechanicsburg, where he was arrested by Detective ZINN, who had been previously advised.

The prisoner is a spare-built man with black hair, black hair and moustache, and a countenance at once indicating reality, and a perfect willingness to commit himself to a sufficient inducement, any black deed. His statement is the most contradictory and unsatisfactory we have ever heard a prisoner enunciate, being a tissue of falsehoods from beginning to end. He represented his home as being at Brooklyn, N. Y., and his business as that of a peddler. He came direct from Hagerstown, Md. This "JOHN SMITH" (which cognomen by the way is entirely assumed), was forwarded to Harrisburg and immediately taken charge of by the military authorities at that post. He has since been strongly guarded to the office of Col. BAKER, Chief of Government Detectives, Washington, D. C.

CHARLES A. HOLTZMAN was born in Alexandria, Va., February 21st 1814, and died April 16th 1865. He was the first man enlisted from Shippensburg. At the end of the first three months he received his country and said he would rather die in battle defending the flag of his Country than to die at home.

The tumult of war shall wake him no more, He is dead to the cannon's loud rattle, He has been laid to rest in our sacred soil, For the hero has fought his last battle.

For the Union he fought for the Union he died, With the flag of his Country before him, Let the nation remember his valor with pride, And the Star Spangled Banner wave for him.
