Kill the Weeds. There is no better month in which kill the Canada thistle, as well as weeds generally, and the destruction of bushes, than August. It is also peculiarly a timewhen farmers are not so much hurried, and when the weeds have fully developed themselves. The best thing to be done with weeds of all kinds extirpated from the land, is to gather them in large heaps to remai there until dry, and then burn them up "root and branch." Kitchen Manures.

One of the amusing inconsistencies of agricultural existence is the fact that one -one!-why, hundreds and thousands indulge in the practice-purchase a bag or a barrel of some advertised mercantile manure in town, at an expense of from three to ten dollars, haul it twelve miles at at a cost of five dollars, and while they are doing this actually throw away a home fertilizer of double the value, that might be saved and prepared for application at a cost of seventy-five cents.

For all manural purposes where any of the ordinary garden vegetables, melous, grape vines and fruit trees are sought to be benefitted, a barrel of mingled soapsuds, greasy dish-water, kitchen scrapings and chamber slops is of more worth than a bag of the best Pacific guano ever brought around Cape Horn.

There are always enough old barrels and tubs knocking about often needlessly knocked to pieces at every farm house to save all such material in If not t were better economy to expend five dol lars for a few second hand barrels to storsuch kitchen offal in, than to let it go utterly to waste, and spend fifteen dollars for some mercantile adulterations of not a quarter of the value.


