On the subject of "The Revolutions of Ideas," Joseph G. Hamblen, Princess Ann, Md. Statesman were not called forth until the times required them. The science and art of war gives birth to great minds. It brings forth the latent strength of nations and individuals. Mr. Hamblen's delivery was forcible and his voice and manner were good.

**Classical Oration.**—Paperston, Md. L. E. McCooms, Hagerstown, Md. Mr. McCooms held that the world is not what it seems. He contended that the wisdom of all nations, that they are easily retained and are as old as language itself; that truths are condensed in popular proverbs and that from them we learn the characteristics of a people.
