We adswer, they are, in most cases, nothing in the world but the old melodeon in disguise. Many of the so-called organs have the same bellows, the same reeds, and the same general internal arrangement. With the bellows turned on edge to gain room, they have simply put on a more pretentious exterior and a more high sounding name. But an organ, to be in reality an organ, must have a while chest or reservoir for air separate from the bellows, into which wind-chest the reeds open, and the tone has room to expand and perfect itself into the full-round tone, similar to the flute or pipe organ, even, smooth, firm, and mellow; and this tone from reeds cannot be obtained in any other way known. 
