If there is really an essential difference in them, if there are some excellent and some worthlessones, the public should have some criterion for judging of them, some facts which will enlighten them. We cheerfully concede the space for this article knowling that there is hardly a family, or church, or school in all the land, bit is more or less interested in this topic. The question is often asked, what are "reed organs?" We adswer, they are, in most cases, nothing in the world but the old meledeen in disglate. With the bellows turned on edge to gain room, they have simply put on a more pretentious exterior and a more high sounding name. 


