STATE AGRICULTURAL SOCIETY .-The quarterly meeting of the Executive Committee of the State Agricultural Society was held on Wednesday. Propositions for the location of the next exhibition were received from Eric Pittsburg, Pottsville, Harrisburg and Norristown, and the President was authorized to appoint a committee of five to select the location, and an additional committee to make all the necessary, proparations and arrangements for the fair. The time for holding the exhibition was fixed at a former meeting, upon the 29th and 80th days of September, and the 1st and 2d days of October next.
