

HARRISBURG LETTER.
HARRISBURG, February 22, 1870.
But little legislation has been done since my last. On Friday the Legislature adjourned until Wednesday morning in order that the members might have some rest from the arduous labors, and that they might, if they choose, celebrate the anniversary of the birth of Washington at their homes. The adjournment, however, was not a resolution, but a mere postponement of the reading of the House bill, Hon. Alex. Adair's vote of the House, to-night, for the reading of Washington's Farewell Address. Much to the regret of every one, Mr. Adair's engagement prevented him attending the following members by a reading of this most excellent, but somewhat antiquated document.
