The bargain sale and transfer of the Democratic party to a few designing and truckling Liberal Republicans, having been ratified and completed by the action of the so-called Democratic Convention held lately at Baltimore, it becomes the right, as well as the duty, of every firm and individual Democrat to make a careful examination of the course pursued by said Convention, as well as the political principles that have always actuated the Presidential candidate, it is endeavoring to force upon the members of the Democratic party and to bring through the following questions: Has the Convention been actuated in its proceedings by those pure and patriotic motives that have ever characterized the actions of the Democratic party? Has it not been influenced by motives of policy and a desire to share the patronage and spoils belonging to the Presidential office? Has it not destroyed the old party landmarks and effaced the true and tried principles of said Democratic party? What has been the political antecedents of Horace Greeley? Has he ever taken back upon his political heresies or ever expressed a regret for having committed or supported them? Has he ever been foremost in the ranks of the party that was arrayed against and opposed to Democratic principles no matter what name it assumed? He has edited the venomous and scurrilous paper called "The Tribune," which paper has never been surpassed by any other in the country, in its low, vile, vulgar, dirty, mean, ungentlemanly, scurrilous and vicious attacks upon the private and political characters of our most illustrious Democrats as well as in its slanderous and false representations of the principles of the Democratic party. He has either originated or strongly advocated all the oppressive and tyrannical measures that were carried out during Lincoln's administration. He praised, eulogized and flattered Gen. Grant's administration until he ceased to control the New York appointments, and has advocated every mean and obnoxious act passed by Congress during said administration. He was not only one of the earliest, but he was also one of the "buckst" bruffers and negro-regulators. He not only praised, but even gloried in the course pursued by Wm. H. Seward in tinkering a certain title silver bill, the soundness of which caused the arrest and imprisonment of some of our purest patriots and most illustrious Democrats in the dreary and loathsome cells of our military forts. Horace Greeley has advocated and used his influence in support of every man that has ever craved this country, and has never gained an unenviable reputation for consistency in his advocacy of them. He advocated the right of secession, and he has not exerted a greater influence or did more, either by his writings or speeches, to prepare the minds of the Southern people to enter into the late rebellion. Believing that he was honest in his views and entertaining the belief that a large portion of the people of the North endorsed him in them, for at that time he was an acknowledged leader in the Republican party, they believing that their course would be approved by him and a large number of his followers in the North inaugurated civil war amongst us. Scarcely had the locust of civil war sounded before Horace Greeley was seized by his own words, recalled his often expressed views on the subject, and advised that the Government should proceed to the most extreme measures in order to punish the poor, deluded and infatuated people whom he had induced by his writings and specious arguments to rebel against our Government, and who he afterwards denounced as traitors of the very worst kind. ("Consistency, thou art a jewel.") For over forty years I have devoted my time and what little influence I possessed in the support and maintenance of Democratic principles as laid down and interpreted by such leaders as Jefferson and Jackson, and I can not now, at this late period of my life, give the lie to my former profession and stultify myself by supporting such an obnoxious candidate as Horace Greeley. Such being the political record of the Presidential candidate presented by the Baltimore Convention, I can not, conscientiously, support him, nor I do so under the circumstances already enumerated. Party organizations are nothing but subordinate agencies by which a certain number of persons seek to carry certain principles into effect. When the subordinate agency ceases to act for the purpose designed and for which it was created, or is prevented by certain political tricksters to a different purpose, such as the nomination for the Presidential office by an open, declared and rightful enemy to the principles of the party, it ceases to exist as party authority. Allegiance is only due to principles and not to a certain individual or a Convention. The Baltimore Convention by its late action has virtually abandoned the party, and it has not destroyed it, by relinquishing its functions for the purpose of organizing a new party under the auspices of a few unscrupulous and designing Liberal Republicans, who do not profess to have abandoned the principles and measures of the old Republican party, but having become simply disappointed and exaggerated, simply because they could no longer control Gen. Grant in his appointments and thus secure for themselves and friends the largest share of the spoils and plunder appertaining to said office, have determined to supplant him, and have arrayed themselves in opposition to his administration, for the purpose of placing a man in his place whom they can more easily and certainly control. The action of the Democratic Convention as Baltimore, therefore, leaves the members of the organization perfectly free to act as to each individual seems fit.

The nomination and endorsement of Greeley relinquishes all persons honestly entertaining Democratic principles from the slightest obligation to vote for Greeley and leaves him free to act in such a way as his conscience and judgment may dictate. These are my views on the great political issues of the day, and I do not wish to be misunderstood, I ask you to publish them in your paper.
