

The Russian Ambassador has been recalled.

Germany. Berlin is said to be surrounded with fearful barricades, which has already been commenced near one of the gates of the city.

Turkey. Recent advices from Constantinople state that preparations were being made to conduct Kossuth and the other Hungarians to Kutahia or Asia Minor.

A despatch of the 20th of March from Trieste, state that the insurrection in Bothnia is extending its ravages, and is increasing in strength.

AN ACT relative to the election of Auditor General, Surveyor General and County Surveyors by the people.

SECTION 1. Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same.

SECTION 2. That the Auditor General and the Surveyor General, elected in pursuance of the first section of this act, shall commission by the Governor of this Commonwealth, and shall assume the duties of their respective offices on the first Tuesday of May next ensuing their election.

SECTION 3. That the general election laws now in force for the choice of a Governor of this Commonwealth, shall regulate the elections of Auditor General and Surveyor General, and in case any vacancy should occur in either of said offices by death, resignation or otherwise.

SECTION 4. That so much of the act twenty-ninth March, Anno Domini, one thousand eight hundred and ninety, as relates to the appointment of an Auditor General or a Surveyor General by the Governor, be and the same is hereby repealed.

SECTION 5. That the qualified voters of each county of this Commonwealth shall, on the second Tuesday of October next, and on the same day every third year, thereafter, elect one competent person being a practical surveyor, to act as county surveyor for the proper county.

SECTION 6. That duplicate returns of the elections of said County Surveyors shall be made out and certified by the return judges, in the manner prescribed by the laws regulating the General elections of this Commonwealth, one copy whereof shall be filed with the clerk of the court of Quarter Sessions of the proper county, and the other transmitted by mail to the Surveyor General, to be filed in his office, and notice of his election shall be given by the return judges to the person receiving the highest number of votes.

SECTION 7. That the person so elected shall at the next court of Quarter Sessions of the proper county, or as soon thereafter as practicable, take and subscribe an oath or affirmation to perform all the duties of his office with fidelity.

SECTION 8. That the courts of Quarter Sessions of the respective counties shall have power, on cause shown, to remove any of said County Surveyors for neglect, refusal, incompetency, or inability to perform the duties of his office, and shall also remove them on being convicted of any infamous crime or misdemeanor.

SECTION 9. That in case of any vacancy occasioned by death, resignation, removal, or otherwise, it shall be the duty of the court of Quarter Sessions of the proper county to appoint a competent person, being a practical surveyor, to fill such vacancy until the time prescribed by this act for the election of said officers.

SECTION 10. That so much of any act of Assembly as authorizes the Surveyor

General to appoint deputies, be and the same is hereby repealed.
