**PROCLAMATION**

WHEREAS, in and by an Act of the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, entitled "An Act to regulate the General Elections within the Commonwealth," it is enjoined on me to give Public Notice of such election to be held, and to enumerate in pursuance of which,

JOHN BRAWLEY, High Sheriff of the county of Cambria, do hereby make known and give this public notice to the Electors of the said county of Cambria, that a General Election will be held in the said county of Cambria on the 22nd day of October next, (being the 8th day of the month) at the several election districts established by law in said county, viz:

The Electors of the district composed of the borough of Ebensburg, to meet at the Court House in said borough.

The Electors of the district composed of the township of Allegheny, to meet at the school house in the town of Loretto in said township.

The Electors of the district composed of the township of Clearfield, to meet at the house of John Douglas, in said township.

name is not contained in the list of taxable inhabitants furnished by the commissioners unless it be produced a receipt for the payment, within two years, of a state or county tax assessed agreeably to the constitution, and give satisfactory evidence either on his own oath or affirmation of another, that he has paid such a tax, or on failure to produce a receipt, shall make oath of the payment thereof, or 2nd if he claim a right to vote by being an elector between the age of 21 and 23 years, he shall depose on oath or affirmation, that he has resided in the state at least one year before his application and make such proof of his residence in the district as is required by this act, and that he does verily believe, from the accounts given him that he is of age aforesaid and give such other evidence as is required by this act, whereupon the name of the person so admitted to vote, shall be inserted in the alphabetical list by the inspectors and a note made opposite thereto by writing the word "tax," if he shall be admitted to vote by reason of having paid tax, or the word "age," if he shall be admitted to vote by reason of such age as shall be added out to the clerks, who shall make the like notes in the list of voters kept by them.

In all cases where the name of the person claiming to vote is found on the list furnished by the commissioners or assessor, or his right to vote whether found therein or not is objected to by any qualified citizen, it shall be the duty of the inspectors to examine such person on oath as to his qualifications, and if he claims to have resided within the state for one year or more, his oath shall not be sufficient proof thereof, but shall make proof thereof by at least one competent witness, who shall be a qualified elector, that he has resided within the district for more than ten days preceding said election, and shall also himself swear that his bona fide residence in this Commonwealth is in the district within the district, and that he does not move into said district for the purpose of voting therein.

Every person qualified as aforesaid and who shall make due proof, if required, of his residence and payment of taxes, as aforesaid, shall be admitted to vote in the township, ward or district, in which he shall reside.

SEC. 1. Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,

That the qualified voters of this Commonwealth shall choose by ballot, one person to fill the office of Auditor General, and one person to fill the office of Surveyor General, and one person to fill the office of Sheriff General, and one person to fill the office of Treasurer General, on the 22nd day of October, Anno Domini, next, at their general election every third year thereafter.

SEC. 3. That the general election laws now in force for the choice of a governor of this Commonwealth, shall regulate the elections of Auditor General and Surveyor General, and in case any vacancy should occur in either of said offices, by death, resignation or otherwise, the same shall be filled by appointment of the Governor; and the person so appointed shall continue in office until the end of the term for which his predecessor was elected.

SEC. 5. That the qualified voters of each county of this Commonwealth shall on the second Tuesday of October next, and on the same day every third year thereafter, elect one competent person, being a practical surveyor, to act as county surveyor for the proper county for the term of three years, who shall do and perform all the duties, and have and receive all the emoluments now pertaining to the respective deputies of the surveyor general.

Pursuant to the provisions contained in the 76th section of the act first aforesaid, the judges of the aforesaid districts shall respectively take charge of the certificate or return of the election of their respective districts, and produce them at a meeting of one judge from each district, at the Court House in the borough of Ebensburg, on the third day after the day of election, being for the present year on FRIDAY the 11th of OCTOBER next, then and there to do, and perform the duties required by law of said judges. Also, that where a judge by sickness or unavoidable accident, is unable to attend said meeting of judges, then the certificate or return aforesaid shall be taken charge of by one of the inspectors or the clerks of the election of said district, who shall do and perform the duties required of said judge unable to attend.
