

ARRIVAL OF THE AFRICA.

Release of the Cuban Prisoners. THE STATE OF THINGS IN FRANCE. NEW YORK, Jan. 2, 1852.

By this arrival we have the gratifying news that the Queen of Spain has yielded to the petitions from America, and has pardoned all the prisoners captured in Cuba during the late insurrection against that island.
