A Bill declaratory of the recent License law was passed by the late Legislature It specifies that the bonds required under the tenth section of the act shall be held as security for the payment of all fines, penalties and costs imposed on the principal obligor for any breach of the act, and no more of the penal sum shall be collected than will cover such fines, penalties and costs. The fecs to be paid to the clerk of court, in addition to the fee for advertising, shall be one dollar for all his services in the matter of each application. Any person fined under the 20th and 30th sections, who shall fail to pay the same, shall be imprisoned until payment is made, with costs.




