Devine officiated as Marshall, exigencies of the public service may require, but not to exceed, at any time, the amount of twenty millions of dollars, nor to be of a less denomination than fifty dollars ; the notes to be paid and redcemed after the expiration of one year from the dates of such notes ; from which dates, until they shall be respectively redeemed, they shall bear such rates of interest as shall be expressed in the sail notes; which rates of interest upon the first issue (which shall not exceed six millions of dollars.) shall be fixed by the Secretary of the Treasury, with the approbation of the President, but in no case to exceed six per cent. per annum. The residue shall be raised, the whole or part, after a public advertisement of not less than thirty days, as the Secretary of the Treasury may direct, by exchanging them at their par value for specie to bidders, who hall agree to make the exchange at the lowest rate of intenst, not exceeding six per eentum per annum.
