WE, THE UNDERSIGNED DIRECTORS OF THE POOR AND HOUSE OF EMPLOYMENT OF CAMBRIA COUNTY, beg leave to offer the following Report: In pursuance of an Act of Assembly, passed the 6th day of May, A. D. 1854, a farm was purchased and the necessary buildings erected thereon for the use of the poor of said County, at a cost of about \$25,000, including the furniture and the necessary fixtures of said building.

The house erected for the use of said poor has been completed, and papers were received by the Directors in November last. The number of inmates at the present time number sixty, which number includes eight insane persons, who were removed from the State Insane Asylum a few days ago, where they have been kept at a very great expense to the county for the last six years. The amount already expended makes the sum of \$45,000, leaving an indebtedness of about \$20,000, which sum is now bearing interest, and should be liquidated as speedily as possible. The Directors would, therefore, urge the collection of taxes with dispatch, and further state, that after said indebtedness is liquidated, the taxes will be greatly reduced from what they have been for the last two years.
