The number of inmates at the present time number sixty, which number includes eight insans persons who were removed from the State Lunatic Hospital a few days ago, where they have been kept at a very great expense to the County for the last six years. The amount already expended makes the sum of \$18500; leaving an indebtedness af about \$6500 which sum is now bearing interest and should be liquidated as speedily as possible. The Directors would therefore urge the collection of Taxes with dispatch and further state that after said indebtedness is liquidated the taxes will be greatly reduced from what they have been for
