Austria.—The pretensions of the Hungarians are represented to be on the increase.—An impression prevailed among leading men that the restoration of the Constitution would not suffice, unless its maintenance was guaranteed by the Powers.

The ultramontane journals of the Tyrol assert that any attempt of the Government of Austria to place all the Christian professions on an equality, would cause general indignation among the Roman Catholics of the Tyrol.

Russia and China.—The following is an extract from a St. Petersburg letter received in London:—

"A courier arrived to-day in 42 days from the Amoor; with great news. The Emperor of China has given the Russians notice to quit, as he had never authorized the cession of territory, and had only just heard of the settlement. Meanwhile the Russian Embassy at Peking is sealed up in its Palace."

The above statement had not in any way been confirmed when the Asia sailed.
