Another Mail Robber Arrested -United Stries Deputy Marshall Dougherty arrested a young man named Bardey thompson, at Huntingdon on Monday, on a charge of rob-ting the Post Office at Mill Creek, in Huntingdon county. Another Small Note Law - A bill has been intaoduced into the Senate, the object of which is to prohibit the circulation of banknoted of a less denomination than \$5 in the State. It requires that all persons, such as merchants, hotel-keepers, brokers, and, in fact, every one engaged in business where there is necessarily much receiving and paying out of money, shall appear before the County Treasurer and make oath that he or they will not pay out or circulate bank-notes of a less denomination than \$5; weereupon, the said Treasurer gaaots him or them a license to carry on their business whatsoever it may be: No action has yet been taken on the subject in either house.
