When to Turn Out Cows. It is best to turn out stock early for several reasons. One is that from the 10th of May to the 10th of June is the best feed month in the year. Another reason for turning out as soon as the grass gets started is, that the stock does better than if kept up until the feed is rank.

Manure. The Country Gentleman says the greater amount of manures we can apply in any year, the larger our fields may be. But it is far better to grow large crops on a few acres, than to grow small crops on a great many acres.

Small Farms well Cultivated. One of the best reasons for commencing farming on a small scale, is found in the fact that farmers are often urged to work less land and cultivate what they do work better.

Charcoal. Charcoal surpasses all other substances in the power which it possesses of condensing ammonia within its pores, particularly when it has been previously treated to redness. It absorbs ninety times its volume of ammoniacal gas, which may be again separated by moistening it with water.

Grafting Wax. Three parts resin, three parts beeswax, and two parts tallow. These are all melted together, and the mixture usually applied with a painter's brush or a wooden blade.

Another Mode. Melt two ounces of resin slowly so as not to make it throw its spirits of turpentine. When it becomes perfectly clear, add a little less than an ounce of alcohol, mix well, and at once cork tight in a bottle.

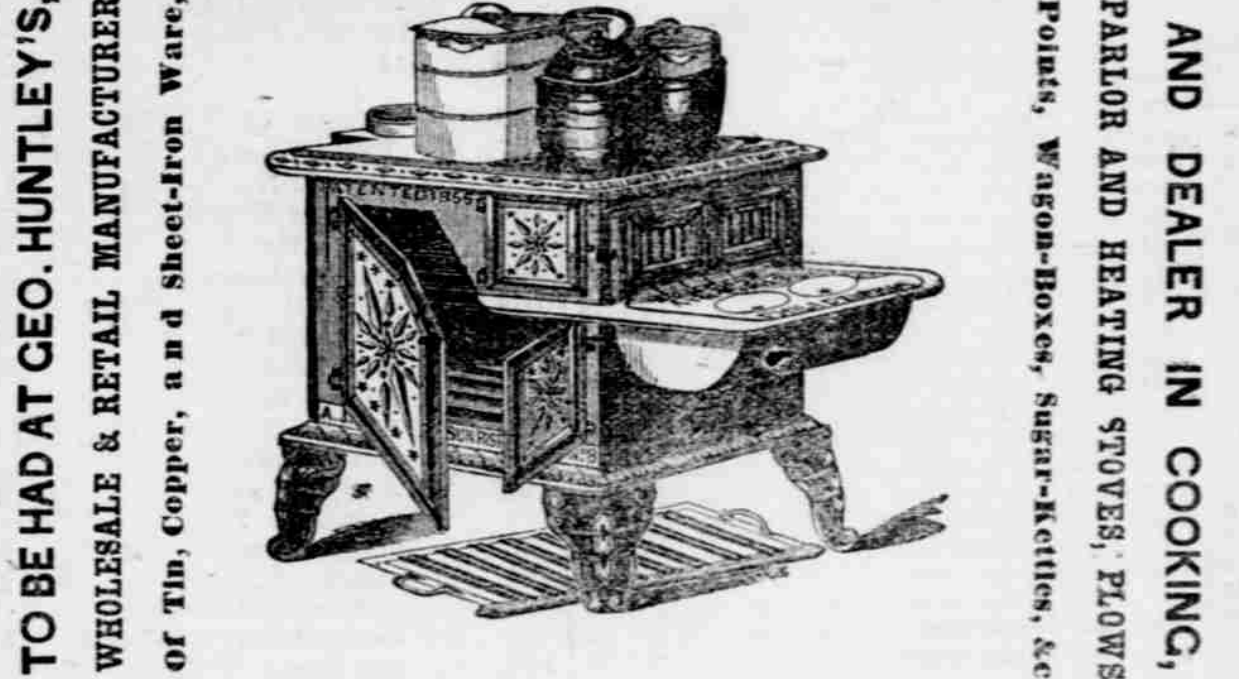
