[From the Lancaster Intelligencer.] What is to be done by the Democratic National Convention, when it re-essembles at Spermatorrhoea, or Seminal Weakness, Sexual Baltimore on the 18th of June? This is a satifactory answer. Unless all the delegates go there in a spirit of conciliation and conpromise, and resolve to commence their work de nozo, we are very much afraid the Convention will find itself in the same predicament it was in when the adjournment took place at Charleston. The best thing, we circumstances, would be to knock all platforms in the head, acknowledge the Constitution of the United States as supreme authority, then nominate some sound conservative Democrat, not identified with extremists from either section of the Union, and, after having done so, adjourn sine die, and the people will take care of the rest.

These quadrennial platforms have been a constant source of injury to the Democratio party and never once a benefit that we could perceive. Before platforms were thought of the Democratic party was always nuited, and triumphantly elected Jefferson, and Madison, and Monroe, and Jackson, and Van Buren. to Presidential office. Then commenced the platform bussiness, and we were defeated in 1840, again in 1848, and may lose a third election in 1860, from the same cause, unless the ensuing Baltimore Convention is more than usually careful. The discussions about slavery are becoming refectly nauseating. The question is worn threadbare, and has lost all interest with the people. The masses care nothing about a platform; they want a candidate of good genuine Democratic stock, who, when he is elected, will administer the Government as it was administered by Thomas Jefferson and Andrew Jackson. Let the Convention give for our standard bearer such a man, and we desire nothing more. He can be triumphantly elected without standing on any platform other than the Constitution and the laws of the country; but fetter him with a platform objectionable to any portion of the party, and the chances are that the Government will fall into the hands of the Black Republicans at the close of the present Administration.
