

LATER FROM EUROPE. Arrival of the City of Washington.

St. Johns, July 27.—The steamship City of Washington, from Liverpool on the 18th, via Queenstown on the 16th inst., passed Cape Race at four o'clock this morning. The news brought by the Associated Press succeeded in reaching the Cape Rice caister, which contained, however, no summary of news, but merely a summary of European intelligence is given.

The British Government is said to have received intelligence of a fearful massacre of Christians at Damascus. Five hundred men were killed, amongst whom was the Dutch Consul. The American Consul was wounded.

The two vessels which passed over the Garibaldi are merchant steamers. It is confirmed that the steamer Velo has passed over to Garibaldi.

At Naples, 14th.—The Patriots are constantly travelling the streets. The moderate party is full of apprehension concerning the stabbing of an inspector of the former police on the 12th, in the Strada de S. Angelo.

A proclamation of Garibaldi against the Bourbon dynasty has been distributed. He says: I am a Royalist, but prefer Victor Emmanuel, who will lead us against Austria.

At Naples, via Terini, 17th.—There has been a conflict between the troops and the people in consequence of popular manifestations in favor of some refugees who had disembarked at Naples. Several persons were killed.

The Ministry has been discontinued, and a new Cabinet formed. From all parts of the country we receive most satisfactory accounts of the harvest.

The extent of ground under cultivation is greater than in any previous year, and the husbandman's labor is promised a rich reward. The great cereal crops, wheat, rye, oats, and corn, are generally in a flourishing condition.
