A Plea for the Cauliflower. "Of all the flowers that grow give me the cauliflower," so said Sam Johnson, the stern old English moralist, and he knew.

We have heard complaint from some gardeners this year, that their cauliflowers did not head up well, and I saw the other day several hundred of them in a garden, and not doctored head in the lot; but other gardeners have succeeded well this year.

Protection of Birds. If our agricultural friends would read Audubon's account of the number of insects he has found in the craw of a single wren, a robin, or a thrush etc, they would feel convinced that small birds should be protected and encouraged.

To keep Cabbage.—Dig shallow trenches in a dry part of the garden—say two feet apart—in which plant the cabbages, which must be carefully taken from the bed with all the roots, pack closely, then erect over them a low scaffolding, the posts being two feet from the ground let be a little high in the middle to carry off the water, and cover with straw or corn fodder, but down. This costs little labor or skill, and will give you cabbage through the winter and spring, about as fresh and good as in October, and perfectly clear of worms and dirt.—Germantown Telegraph.

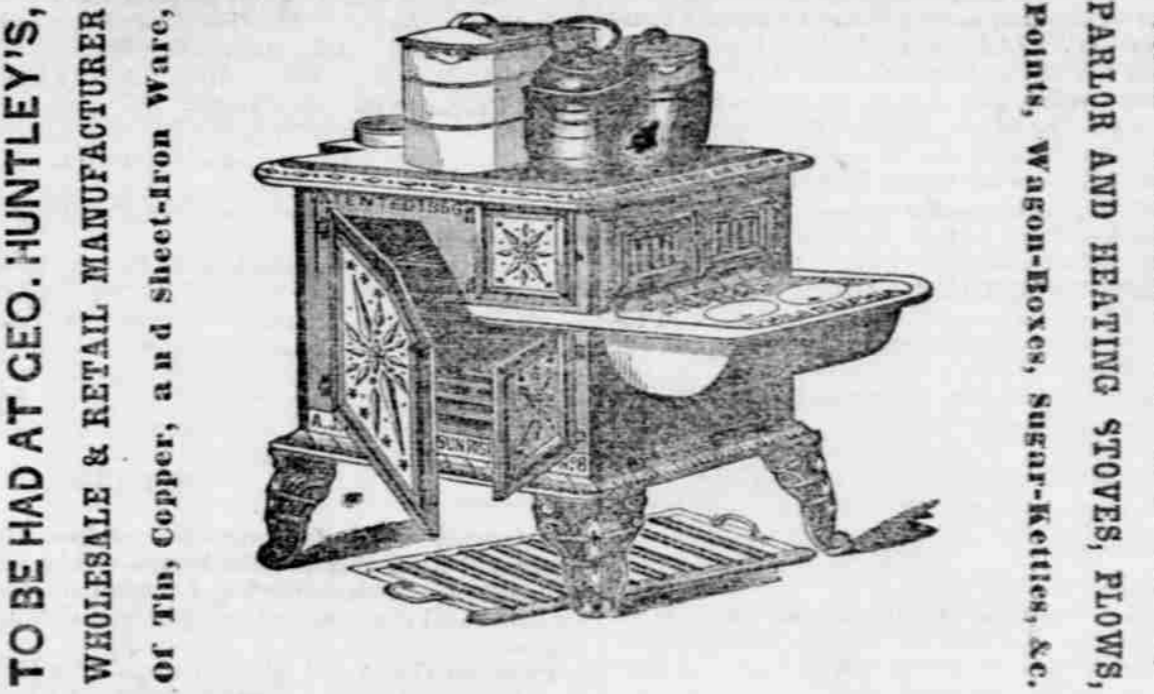
