

(From the Harrisburgh Patriot & Union.) WASHINGTON CORRESPONDENCE.

WASHINGTON CITY, March 10th 1862 Dear Patriot—Eulogic rays of light and hope are beaming from the horizon of our political embarrassment and national troubles.

From private conversations with conservative Republicans, I am satisfied that the Constitutional status of all the Southern States will be preserved inviolate, notwithstanding outward appearance to the contrary.

The confiscation bill will be voted down in the Senate by a significant and decided majority. The vote upon it will draw the lines between conservatism and Abolitionism—between the true friends of the Union, and those of the intended Abolition candidate Fremont.

So that when this war is closed, the States will be handed over to the people thereof, with all the Constitutional guarantees as they came from our fathers. Senator Trumbull, of Illinois, who introduced the confiscation bill, is the only quasi friend of the President, but Senator Browning of that State, is the special and confidential friend of Mr. Lincoln, and will follow the wake of Senator Cowan and make a speech today in opposition to Trumbull's bill; and he will be followed on the same side, by Senators Colman, of Vermont; Fresden, of Maine; Harris, of New York; Doolittle, of Wisconsin; Clark, of New Hampshire; Ten Eyck, of New Jersey; Howe, of Michigan; and probably by Foster and Dixon, of Connecticut, and others, whose votes, added to the fifteen Union Whigs and Democrats, will of course leave the Abolition wing in the minority.

And it is well for the country that it is so; for, from what I can learn concerning the Democratic sentiment of the Army, both officers and men—and they are very largely in the majority—rather than fight the Secessionists of the South, merely for the abolition of slavery, would turn their bayonets against the Abolitionists of the North, and thus root out those who were the original cause of this war.

God forbid, that in our overburdened troubles, such a contingency should become necessary. But, if it should, the war would soon be brought to a close; for the whole South—Union men and all—and all the conservatives of the North, which now constitute a large majority of the North would unite against the meagre faction, mostly confined to the New England States and crush them out in less than a month.

And thus the only barrier to a reunion of the North and South would be removed, and the Union would be itself again, resting peacefully and harmoniously on its ancient basis of fraternity and equality. However, there is every reason to believe that the turning point in the conflict with the South is close at hand, and will be settled by the sword, within the next ten days.

Within that period, I expect, the gallant McClellan with his serried hosts of brave warriors will plant the flag of the Union upon the inner ramparts of the rebellion forces, in the Metropolis of the Southern Confederacy. The signs of this event are unmistakable—but "man's" word.

The late message of the President, proposing the adoption by Congress of a resolution to aid any of the Southern States, who may wish to abolish slavery, is regarded as a mere sop in the pan for Abolitionists to lick and lap, in order to divert them from mischief, and I see it has the desired effect; for Greeley of the Tribune, goes at it with such a phrensic gusto that there is danger of his smothering a hole through the bottom of the pan. The message proposes nothing without the consent of the States to which the offer is to be made; and, by inference, it clearly recognizes the rights guaranteed by the Constitution.
