Amour & Co's, MENAGERIE. A collection of wild animals, the best now travelling in the States, will give two exhibitions on Monday next.

By the arrival of the schooner Flying Dragon, at Boston, on Wednesday morning, we have intelligence from New Orleans to the 22d ultimo, on which day the vessel sailed from that city.

The health of New Orleans is good, and the troops are in fine condition. There is no yellow fever, and it is hoped that from the sanitary regulations being enforced, there will be much less than the usual number of cases.

Political prisoners continue to be sent to Fort Jackson, from two to six going down each day. A few days before the Flying Dragon sailed, there was a funeral in the city, and the coffin was deposited, after the usual ceremonies, in a tomb.

From information which Gen. Butler had received he ordered an examination of the coffin to be made afterwards, as the cause of death of the person which it was said to contain was not satisfactory to him.

On opening the coffin no corpse was found, but in its place a large amount of gold coin, which was immediately taken possession of in the name of the Government.

Specie continues to be found which had been secreted by the rebels, and in all cases it is seized.

Later News from Charleston. New York, June 13.—A special despatch to the Post from Washington says that Mr. Pierce, the Government Superintendent of cotton lands in South Carolina, has arrived there.

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Several gun boats and rams are starting on a reconnaissance up the White river.

AN ORDINANCE.

RELATING TO widening and straightening of certain parts of Main Street, and regulating of pavements in the Borough of Carrolltown.

Section 1st.—Be it ordained by the Burgess and Town Council of the Borough of Carrolltown, and it is hereby ordained by the authority of the same, That it is necessary for the general improvement, and further benefit of said Borough, to widen Main Street, making it eighty feet wide, or as near this as the buildings on said street will permit, to be governed by a straight line, corresponding with the front walls of the present dwellings on the east side of Main Street, beginning at the Alley on the south side of John Platt's lot, and extending to Carroll Street, declaring public stock property as had been heretofore considered private on the west side of Main Street, outside of a straight line, beginning at the north-east corner of J. E. Maucher's dwelling on the corner of Main and Carroll Streets, and extending south as far as the original plan of the street will permit retaining the width of eighty feet.

Section 2d.—That that part of Main Street in front of Jos. Zolner's lot shall be widened, beginning at the south west corner of said Jos. Zolner's lot on the east side of Main Street, making it as wide as the north west corner of his lot as the house of the same will permit.

Section 3d.—That the pavement shall make an angle at the south east corner of A. Geis' porch and run slanting to correspond with the pavement in front of A. Foster's house.
