A building in which some twenty armed rioters were plying their work of plunder, was surrounded by the police There was only one door of exit, and every rioter as he appeared at this door, was handsomely beaten to the ground by the police.

The mob was also defeated by the police, aided by regulars, in Fifth avenue, between 38th and 48th streets.

A heavy riot is also going on in Tenth avenue.

THE TRIBUNE AND TIMES OF-FICE THREATENED.

The mob this afternoon got as far down town as the Fulton Ferry, visiting many vessels and stealing whatever they wanted.

A full force of employees of the Government is at the New York Post Office to-night, with arms and two cannon.






