THE MOB FIRED ON. EIGHT O'CLOCK, P. M.—The day so far has been a fearful one. There was an awful riot in the Second Avenue this afternoon, in which the military charged and fired several times, killing fifteen and wounding many.

A building in which some twenty armed rioters were plying their work of plunder, was surrounded by the police. There was only one door of exit, and every rioter as he appeared at this door, was handsomely beaten to the ground by the police.

THE TRIBUNE AND TIMES OFFICE THREATENED. NINE O'CLOCK, P. M.—The offices of the Tribune and Times are barricaded to-night with bundles of printing paper. A heavy force of police is about them, and in front of the Times is a small cannon which fires two balls at a discharge.

A full force of employees of the Government is at the New York Post Office to-night, with arms and two cannon. TENS O'CLOCK, P. M.—There is much rioting to-night at the Eighth Avenue and Twenty-ninth street, where the mob appears to have some kind of headquarters.

Excitement in Brooklyn. During the absence of the police from Brooklyn last night, there was a mob raised in the Second ward, which sacked nearly every house occupied by colored people in that locality, and beat the inmates in a terrible manner.

Excitement in Jersey City. A number of empty cars were dispatched from Jersey City this morning for the purpose it is stated of bringing on troops from Pennsylvania.

Excitement in Jersey City. The draft in Jersey City, it is understood, was to have taken place on Monday next, but on account of the popular feeling has been indefinitely postponed.

Excitement in Jersey City. Great excitement prevailed in Jersey City last evening on account of a rumor to the effect that a number of the rioters were going to cross the river and tear up the railroad track, so as to prevent the arrival of troops.
