than the misnomer which the act so studiously applies to the militia-some reason that deserves to stand instead of Magna Charta, our Constitution, and all our traditional freedom.

The only general reason that I have ever heard suggested, and which is applicable against all the views advanced in this opinion, is called military necessity. The country is involved in a great civil war which can be brought to an honorable close by an energetic use of all our resources, and no restrains should be tolerated, in such circumstances save only those which christian civilization has imposed on all welfare. The amount of the argument is that the exigencies of the times justify the substitution of mastial law for the Conetitution. But what is martial law? for postage will be acceptable.

Bad as they are, we make them worse by substituting arbitrary power for constitutional rule; but if we made them better and not worse, the judicial mind ought not to be expected to approve the substitution, for it recognise no violation of the Constitution as a legitimate vindication of the Constitation. For these reasons I am for granting the injunction.
