The Governor and State Treasrer are authorized to borrow three milon dollars on the faith of the Commononwealth; to issue certificates of loan coupon bonds, of not less than one undred dollars, bearing six per cent. per nnum interest, payable semi-annually Philadelphia not be taxable for any surpose, and to be reimbursable any time fter ten years.

Sec. 2. Bonds to be signed by the lovernor, countersigned by the State Treasurer and Auditor General. The Governor is authorized to draw warrants on the Treasurer for expenses of negotiating loan, to be paid out of the treasury. Sec. 3 Authorizes the Governor to appoint one major general and two brigadier generals, of military education, skill, and experience, to have command of all


