Residuem asphaltum is used to fire steamengines in a portable form. In a short time every article of apparrel worn by ladies will be colored by asphaltum. We sent last year to Europe over twenty million dollars worth of petroleum in addition to double that amount consumed at home. It takes the place of cotton as a basis of wealth; it keeps the ships of our national marine employed in carrying freight to and fro all over the world. Recently it took a voyage of two or three years to procure a thousand barrels of oil, while at the present time a single well has been known to yield as many barrels in one day.
