While Broadway is thronged on Sunday with thousands of people in gay attire, flocking to the temples of worship, very different scenes are occurring in other.parts of the city. Within five minutes walk of Broadway, on either side, below Grand street, are exhibitions of the most shama-

less debauchery and prostitution-heathenism that would shame the worshippers of Juggernaut, or the man eaters of the Canibal islands The profligates of every description congregate in the lowest dens of infamy and vice, and give lones rein to most brutal: passions, indulging in every degrading excess, plundering and being plundered

Sunday is a regular barvest for the keepers of low grogeries and houses of ill fame. Such of the laborers as are given to dissipation, who find little time and less means to gratify their persions thro' the week, with their weeks wages in their pockets and a day of leisure upon their hands, systematically patronize these catablish-

ments on Sunday. The principal business of the Police Courts on Monday is, invariably, the disposal of cases of disorderly conduct, assaults. quarrels, vagrancy, and beastly intoxication The returns from the various wards on Monday, usually contain records of about one hundred arrests for intoxication; yet this is but a faint indication of the scenes of dobauchery that are enacted in the basements and garrets where dissipation of every kind ruins riot.
