If any further sum should be wanted for that purpose due notice thereof will be glven,—Application for admission must in all cases be made to the officers of the Board, who will submit the same to the Trustees of the Institution for examination and decision. It is desired that pupils enter at the commencement of a quarter, or as soon afterwards as practicable.
