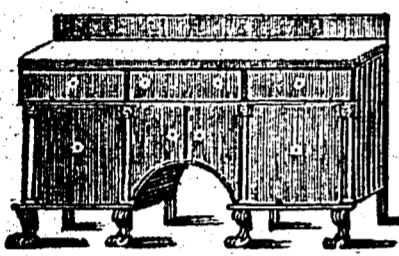

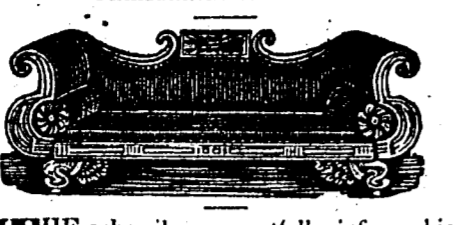

WHEREAS, By the 11th section of the School Law, passed the 13th of June, 1836, one hundred thousand dollars, in addition to the one hundred thousand dollars payable by the Bank of the United States...

And whereas, the aforesaid sum of two hundred thousand dollars is directed by the 10th Section of said act, to be paid by the General Superintendent directly to the Treasurers of the respective Districts...
