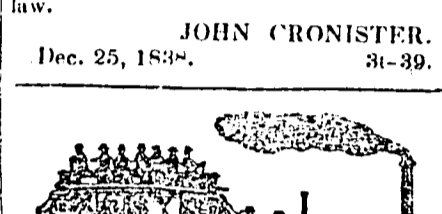

In the Second District composed of the township of Germany, at the house now occupied by Alfred Cole, in the town of Littlestown, in the township of Germany.
In the Third District, composed of that part of the township of Berwick, not included in the 15th district, at the house of John Miley, Esq. in the town of Oxford.
In the Fourth District, composed of the township of Latimore, and that part of Huntingdon township, not included in the 11th District, at the house of Daniel Miller, in the township of Huntingdon.

In the Tenth District, composed of the township of Conowingo, at the house of Adam Oster, in M'Shertystown.
In the Eleventh District, composed of the township of Tyrone, and all that part of Huntingdon township south of the road leading from East Berlin to Carlisle, and east of the state road, including all the voters residing contiguous to said State road, at the house of Frederick Bowers, in Heidelberg, in Tyrone township.
In the Twelfth District, composed of the township of Mountjoy, at the house of Mrs. Larimer, in said township.

By the 15th section of the act of the 16th of February, 1799, it is provided that the Judges and Inspectors chosen for and before the preceding general election, shall attend and serve as such respectively at such occasional election; and the said Inspectors and Judges will therefore meet at the proper place in their respective districts, on the day of election aforesaid, at nine o'clock in the forenoon, to do and perform the several duties enjoined on them by law.
The Return Judges of the several Election Districts, are to meet at the Courthouse in the Borough of Gettysburg, on Friday the 18th of January next, at 11 o'clock, A. M. with certificates of the Elector in their respective districts, to perform the duty required of them by law.
And in and by an act of the General Assembly passed on the 2d of April 1821, it is enacted and declared that every person holding an office of profit or trust under the government of the U. States, whether a commissioned officer or otherwise, a subordinate officer or agent, who is or shall be employed under the legislative, executive or judiciary departments of the United States; and also, that every member of Congress is by law incapable of holding or exercising at the same time the office or appointment of Judge, Inspectors or Clerk of any election in this state.
And by an act of the General Assembly, entitled, "an act of regulating election districts," passed the 18th day of April, 1828, it is provided in Section 58, "That no Inspector, Judge, or other officer of any election, shall be eligible to any office at such election, nor shall any person holding an office under the General or State government, be an Inspector, Judge, or other officer of any such election.
