HARRISBURG, January 1, 1-39. Y virtue of the authority vested in the Adjutant General, by the militia laws of this Commonwealth, it is hereby directd by him, with the consent and concurrence of the Governor, and Commander-inthief of Pennsylvania, that the system of instruction in military knowledge, and regulations for the Militia and Volunteers of the State of Pennsylvania, be, from and: after this date, that system which has been prepared and arranged by Brevet Captain S. Cooper, (of the U.S. Army,) Aid decamp and Assistant Adjutant General, and is entitled "a concise system of instructions and Regulations for the Militin and Volun-

teers of the U. States," &c. All officers and non-commissioned officers, musicians and privates of the Militia or Volunteers of this State, will therefore henceforth conform, in the performance of their military duties, to the regulations for their government prescribed in the above sick headache.
