I. All Animals, to be entitled to compete for Premiums, shall have been kept and owned in the County, by the persons presenting them, at least four months BOUGHT L W, AND FOR SALE AT A RER, I would name MOSES HACKET, previous to the Annual Fair, and all animals, except breeding stock, shall have been Esq., of Ulysses-subject to the decision of bred and raised in the County; but when Working Oxen or Matched Horses or the Republican County Convention.
