MAPLE SUGAR—LARGE YIELD.—The Burlington (Vt.) Press states that E. Pitkin, of Marshfield, made 3,000 lbs. of maple sugar this Spring, from 330 trees, and that the yield in Cambridge was 185,000 lbs., and that the sugar season of 1859 has eclipsed that of 1857. The Concord Patriot says the yield of maple sugar in the northern part of New-Hampshire is immense this season. In Coos it is no unusual thing to hear of eight, ten and twelve hundred pounds being made in an ordinary sugar orchard, and in some orchards a ton or more has been made.—L. S. Savage.

We do not know how much sugar was made in this county this year, but we have reason to think that the yield did not fall much short of that of 1857.
