Election of County Superintendent.

Pursuant to act of Assembly, the School Directors of Potter County met in Convention at the Court House in Coudersport, Monday, May 7th, 1860. Called to order by J. Hendrick, Co. Superintendent. Organized by calling Hon. Joseph Mann to the Chair and electing Almeron Nelson, Vice President; C. S. Jones, Secretary, and E. Thatcher, Assistant Secretary. The list of Directors was then called when one hundred and twenty-one answered to their names. Jno. M. Kilbourn then moved to fix the salary of the County Superintendent at three hundred dollars per annum. J. S. Mann, moved to amend by inserting six in the place of three. After debate by Jno. M. Kilbourn, Jno. S. Mann, Pliny Harris and others, the question was called on the amendment. Ayes, 40; Nays, 73. A motion was then made to amend by fixing the salary at five hundred dollars per annum. Vote on the second amendment resulted in Ayes, 83; Nays, 42. So the salary was fixed at five hundred dollars per annum. On motion, then proceeded to vote for County Superintendent, with the annexed result:

THEODORE PARKER writes from Rome that an American there is astonished at the sacrifice of the useful arts to the fine arts, and says, "If I had a son, I should rather he would be an engineer, a great mason, carpenter, or railroad builder, than a great painter, sculptor or fiddler; and certainly I should rather that my son were an ordinary third rate tailor, shoemaker, brazier, than an ordinary third rate sculptor to spoil marble, and waste the time of the men he strove to make statues of."

The two principal centres of the Boot and Shoe Manufacture in the United States, are Philadelphia, and Lynn, Mass., the latter being the centre for the common and cheap work, the former of the fine sewed work. There are about five hundred Manufacturers of Boots and Shoes in Philadelphia, including some who do work for both customers and jobbers, and their annual product exceeds in value four millions of dollars. The entire trade of the city in these indispensable articles is estimated at fifteen millions of dollars.

THE JOHN BROWN FUND.—We have seen two West India merchants who have just arrived from Hayti. One of them, who is an accomplished and educated gentleman, and a cousin of President Guffard, informs us that when he left Port au Prince, two weeks ago, the contributions of coffee for the benefit of John Brown's family amounted to about 2,000 bags of 120 pound each, and it was the general opinion that another thousand bags would be added, as everybody regarded it both a duty and a privilege to contribute. As these bags are worth from \$12 to \$14 each, it is probable that the Republic of Hayti will add to the John Brown fund from \$30,000 to \$40,000.—N. Y. Tribune, 24th.

THE crops in Eastern Pennsylvania and Western New Jersey, (says the Germantown Telegraph, of Wednesday last,) never looked better at this season of the year. The winter grain is especially fine; and the grass, so far as we have ascertained, was very little winter-killed, and promises a heavy yield. The oats crop is beautiful, having been mostly sown in March. Corn will be planted to some extent this week; but next week and the week after the bulk of the crop will be put in the ground. The first and second planting of potatoes will now soon be followed by the late or last planting. The promise of fruit was never more encouraging, though the frost of the nights of the 13th and 14th (and since then, of the 24th) did some damage. We anticipate a season of plenty.

PAINTED POST, May 8, 1860.—A most destructive fire occurred here yesterday, involving the loss of nearly \$60,000. The fire was first discovered in the boundary of Curtis & Colvin, which, with the building attached, was destroyed. The barn and livery stable of the Lovell House, the building known as the Badger Block, the dwelling of J. P. Bennett, the dwelling of H. G. Blood, the dwelling and shop of Mr. Wilder, the dwelling of G. Brown, and the dwelling of O. Jordan were also completely destroyed. The fire is attributed to spontaneous combustion from the foundry.

Curtis & Erwin's loss is \$50,000; insured for \$10,000. Loss in the Badger Block, \$2,000; no insurance. J. P. Bennett's loss, \$1,000; no insurance. Mr. Wilder was insured for \$1,200. G. Brown's loss, \$800; no insurance.

THE Hon. Jacob Fry retired on Tuesday a week from the office of Auditor General of the State, the duties of which were that day assumed by his successor, Hon. Thomas E. Cochran, of York. Hon. John Rowe, the same day relinquished the office of Surveyor General of the State to Gen. Keim, who was elected in October last to succeed him.
