THE EDUCATIONAL ASSOCIATION AND TEACHERS' INSTITUTE OF POTTER COUNTY, will hold its Semi-Annual Session at Coudersport, March 12th, 13th, 14th, and 15th, 1861. In addition to the usual course of drills, discussions, &c., a course of Lectures will be delivered on School Organization and Discipline. Four evening lectures will be delivered, commencing on the evening of the 11th, and on the evening of the 15th the teachers will hold their levee. It is hoped to make this session a season of pleasure and profit, and a large attendance is desired.
