

General Richardson's division was held in reserve, and hence our bringing up far behind those of the Union army engaged in the more immediate pursuit of the enemy. Notwithstanding our being far behind, there were whole Brigades, and even Divisions, still in our rear. We left our former camp (Winfield Scott,) early on the morning of the 5th, (Monday) and marching until three or four P. M., were halted and ordered to pitch tents. We were then just in sight of the Rebel works at Yorktown. Had just finished putting up our tents when we were ordered to strike them again, and proceeding on our weary way, did not again halt only for a moment or two at times, until half-past ten at night. We were at last allowed to unsling knapsacks and build fires, though pitching our tents was prohibited. We here eked out a little modicum of rest until dawn of day when we again resumed the march and marched until half past six P. M. You can form some idea of our fatigue when you take into consideration the fact of its raining from early morning until night, and the mud was actually knee deep in many places, and over shoes, fully one half of the distance made. Tuesday night we were ordered to have all baggage loaded, knapsacks slung, and men in line ready to march at half-past six on Wednesday morning. The order intimated that we would return to Yorktown and there take river transportation to West Point, some thirty miles above this point. We accordingly returned; have not yet gone to West Point, though a good many troops have. There is some doubt existing as to our future destination. I understand that those who are supposed to be well informed think that there is a slight possibility of our going to some other point. Our own opinion is that the original plan will yet be pursued; though we must confess to caring very little, so it helps the most effectually to crush the remaining strength of the rebellion.

A story which has gained considerable credence in our Brigade is, that our General, (a Captain of artillery in the Regular Army,) has been ordered to report for service with his battery, and that two of the Regiment's composing his Brigade are to garrison Gloucester Point, while the other two are to be put in other Brigades. Should this prove true, the 5th Pennsylvania will be one of the Regiments retained for active service. Recollect, I only give the rumor for what it may be worth, not vouching for its authenticity. It may after all, turn out what we call a "Guard House story,"—should not be surprised should a few days' time stigmatize it as one of that class.

This morning, in company with Sergeant Mann, I strolled through the famous old town which has gained such celebrity in two wars. The general appearance of the town would indicate that it was founded before the Revolution, and that to the foundation, nothing had been added, if, indeed, we except the rebel barracks. A few squalid, old houses, a few old chimneys, a court house, remarkable only for its extreme old age, constitute the whole of Yorktown. The location is splendid, being on the right bank of the York river, on high ground, and overlooking the surrounding country. From the rebel works including the town you get a splendid view of the country, river and of the almost equally famous Gloucester Point, directly opposite.

Of the fortifications I can only say, that our little General would have reduced them, had the rebels remained; but their reduction must have cost many valuable lives. The works are very formidable and mounted by guns of heaviest calibre. We noticed three which had burst, causing us to judge from their appearances, no little ostentation inside the fort. We noticed only one or two spiked, the nearly all were loaded. The same filth, the same loose habits, the same destructiveness, seemed to prevail here as at Manassas. The air was perfectly loaded with the foul stench engendered by neglect of properly policing the refuse matter which necessarily accumulates in a large encampment.

Captain Jones, in common with his command, is enjoying good health, much better I think, than heretofore, and withal an arduous of good spirits.

We make the following extracts from a letter written to a friend in this county:

WASHINGTON, May 15, 1862.

DEAR FRIEND GEORGE: We remained in our sick, new camp at Goodhope a week and then were brought here for active Provost duty. Col. II is quartered alone in a good brick house fronting the Capitol grounds and our dozen rods from the north-east corner of the Capitol. The remainder of the Regt is located in different parts of the city. Our business is patrolling the city and arresting all the drunken and disorderly, and at night all soldiers after half-past nine, who have not the Provost Marshal's pass. Besides this we shut up grog-shops, dance-houses, &c., seizing the inmates and contents, taking them to the central guard house where their cases are investigated. The city swarms with villainy of all shades and grades, and our boys have plenty of business. If a drunken soldier is taken he is questioned as to where he got his "licker" and probably the next evening the Provost General makes the place a call, and either throw the "fire water" into the gutter or lock it up, according to circumstances or the conduct of the inmates. The guard visit theatres, gambling saloons and other places they suspect to be the resort of soldiers. The city police act with the guard, directing their visits and helping take care of the

Night before last our company broke up a gambling saloon, last night a house of ill-fame, taking some soldier's clothes, blankets and recovering the pocket-book and contents of a soldier who had been robbed. To night a call was made on us to clean out a similar den, and it is the plan to try one of the worst to-morrow night. The police call upon us quite frequently for a squad to help them hunt out some rascality. They have not full power over the soldiers, but the provost guard can look out for them, and between the police and patrol who have full power to search everywhere, they make the rogues hustle their corn sometimes.

I have visited many places in and about Washington. Have taken a nap in the Senate and when not napping have listened to some of the debates, and have also listened to the noise of the House which is about all you generally hear. Yesterday afternoon I went into the conservatory and some of the 'hot-houses' below the Capitol, and saw some of the most beautiful flowers and some of the most curious plants, among others the Bauyan or Indian Fig, the leaves of which would almost cover an ordinary sized person. If they are the kind of leaves Adam and Eve used for aprons it would not have required many for a blanket. The Capitol grounds are a pleasant promenade these warm days, especially when the fountains are in operation. ADRIAN.
