Election Proclamation.

PURSUANT to an Act of the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, entitled "An Act relating to the elections of this Commonwealth," approved the second day of July, A. D. one thousand eight hundred and thirty-nine. I, D. C. LARRABEE, Sheriff of the county of Potter, Pennsylvania, do hereby make known and give notice to the electors of the county aforesaid, that a General Election will be held in the said county of Potter on the Second Tuesday (Third day) of October, 1863, at which time State and County Officers, as follows are to be elected, to wit:

- One person for Governor of Pennsylvania.
- One person for Judge of the Supreme Court of Pennsylvania.
- Two persons for Members of the House of Representatives of the general Assembly of Pennsylvania, in conjunction with the county of Tioga, to represent the counties of Tioga and Potter.
- One person for Prothonotary and Clerk of Courts of the county of Potter.
- One person for Commissioner of the county of Potter.
- One person for Register and Recorder of the county of Potter.
- One person for Auditor of the county of Potter.
- One person for Coroner of the county.

I also make known and give notice, as in and by the 13th section of the aforesaid Act I am directed, that every person excepting Justices of the Peace, who holds any office or appointment of profit or trust under the Government of the United States, or this State, or of any city or incorporated district, whether a commissioned officer or otherwise, a subordinate officer or agent, who is or shall be employed under the legislative, judiciary, or executive departments of this State or the United States, or of any city or incorporated district, and also that every member of Congress and of the State Legislature, and of the select and common council of any city, or commissioner of any incorporated district, is by law incapable of holding or exercising at the same time the office or appointment of Judge, Inspector, or clerk of an election in this Commonwealth, and that no Inspector or Judge, or other officer of any such election shall be eligible to be voted for.

Also, that in the fourth section of the Act of Assembly, entitled "An Act relating to elections and for other purposes," approved April 16th, 1860, it is enacted that the aforesaid 13th section shall not be so construed as to prevent any Military Officer or Borough Officer from serving as Judge, Inspector, or Clerk of any general or special election in this Commonwealth.

It is further directed that the meeting of the return Judges at the Court House in Coudersport to make out the general returns, shall be the first Friday succeeding the general election, which will be the 16th day of October. I also here make known and give notice that the places for holding the aforesaid general election in the several townships and boroughs within the county of Potter, are as follows, to wit:
