Election Proclamation.
PU SUANT to an Act of the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, entitled "An Act relating to the Elections of this Commonwealth," approved the second day of July, A. D. one thousand eight hundred and thirty-nine, W. W. BROWN, Sheriff of the county of Potter, Pennsylvania, do hereby make known and give notice to the electors of the county aforesaid, that a General Election will be held in the said county of Potter on the Second Tuesday (Ninth) of October, 1866, at which time District and County Officers, as follows, are to be elected to wit:

One person for Governor of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.
 One person for Member of Congress, for the XVIII Congressional District, comprising the counties of Centre, Clinton, Lycoming, Tioga and Potter.
 Two persons for Members of the House of Representatives of the General Assembly of Pennsylvania, in conjunction with the county of Tioga to represent the counties of Tioga and Potter.
 Two persons for Associate Judges of the county of Potter.
 One person for Prothonotary of the county of Potter.
 One person for Treasurer of the county of Potter.
 One person for Register & Recorder of the county of Potter.
 One person for Commissioner of the county of Potter.
 Two persons for Auditors of the county of Potter.
 I also make known and give notice, as in and by the 13th section of the aforesaid act I am directed, that every person excepting Justices of the Peace, who hold any office or appointment or trust under the Government of the United States or this State, or of any city or incorporated district, whether a commissioned officer or otherwise, subordinate officer or agent, who is or shall be employed under the legislative, judiciary, or executive departments of this State or the United States, or of any city or incorporated district and also that every Member of Congress and of the State Legislature, and of the select and common council of any city, or commissioner of any incorporated district, is by law incapable of holding or exercising at the same time the office or appointment of Judge, Inspector or clerk of any election in this Commonwealth. Also, that in the fourth section of the Act of Assembly, entitled "An Act relating to elections and for other purposes," approved April 16, 1860, it is enacted that the aforesaid 13th section shall not be so construed as to prevent any Military Officer or Borough officer from serving as Judge, Inspector, or Clerk of any General or special election in this Commonwealth.

Also, that in the 1st section of an Act of Assembly entitled "An Act Regulating the mode of voting at all Elections in the several counties of this Commonwealth," approved March 30th, 1866, it is enacted: That the qualified voters of the several counties of this Commonwealth, at all general, township, borough and special elections, are hereby, hereafter, authorized and required to vote, by tickets, printed, or written, or partly printed and partly written, severally classified as follows: One ticket shall embrace the names of all Judges of courts voted for, and to be labelled, "outside, judiciary"; one ticket shall embrace the names of all state officers voted for, and to be labelled, "state"; one ticket shall embrace the names of all county officers voted for, including office of senator, member, and members of assembly, if voted for, and members of congress, if voted for, and to be labelled, "county"; one ticket shall embrace the names of all township officers voted for, and to be labelled, "township"; one ticket shall embrace the names of all borough officers voted for, and to be labelled, "borough"; and each class shall be deposited in separate ballot-boxes.

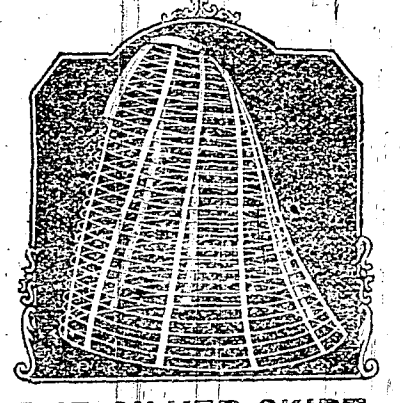

 It is further directed that the meeting of the return Judges at the Court House in Condesport to make out the general returns, shall be the first Friday succeeding the general election, which will be the 12th day of October.
