D. one thousand eight hundred and thirty-nine, I. W. W. BROWN. Sheriff of the county of Potter, Pennsylvania, do hereby make known and give notice to the electors of the county aforesaid, that a General Election will be held in the said county. of Potter on the Second Tuesday (Ninth) of Cctober, 1866, at which time District and County Officers, as follows, are to be elected

One person for Member of Congress, for the XVIII Congressional District, comprising the counties of Centre, Clinton, Lycoming, Tioga and Potter.

Two persons for Members of the House of Representatives of the General Assembly of Pennsylvania, in conjunction with the county of Tioga to represent the counties of Tioga

Two persons for Associate Judges of the county of Potter. One person for Prothonotary of the county

One person for Treasurer of the county of One person for Register & Recorder of the

county of Potter. One person for Commissioner of the county of Potter.

Two persons for Auditors of the county of Potter. I also make known and give notice, as in

I also make known and give notice, as in and by the 13th section of the aforesaid act I am directed, that every peson excepting Justices of the Peace, who hold any offic or appointment or profit or trust under the Government of the United States or this State, or of any city or incorporated district, whether a commissioned officer or otherwise a subordinate officer or agent, who is or shall be empioyed under the legislative, judiciary, or executive departments of this State or the United States, or of any city or incorporated district and also that every Memper of Congress and of the State Legislature, and of the select and of the State Legislature and of the sefect and common council of any city, or commissioner of any incorporated district, is by law incapable of holding or exercising at the same time the office or appointment of Judge, Inspector or clerk of any election in this common wealth.

Also, that in the fourth section of the Act

of Assembly, entitled "An Act relating to elections and for other purposes," approved April 16, 1860, it is evacted that the aforesaid 13th section shall not be so construed as to prevent any Military Unicer or Borough officer from serving as Judge, Inspector, or Clerk of any General or special election in this Commonwealth.
Also, that in the 1st section of an Act of

Assembly entitled "Ah Act Regulating the mode of voting at all Elections in the several counties of this Commonwealth," approved March 30th, 1866, it is enacted: That the qualified voters of the several counties of this commonwealth, at all general, township horough and special elections, are hereby, hereafter, authorized and required to vote, by after, authorized and required to jote, of tickets, in inted, or written, or partly printed and partly written, severally classified as follows: One ticket shall embrace the names of all Judges of courts voted for, and to be labelled, outside, "judicity", "one ticket shall embarce the names of all state officers voted for, and he labelled, "state;" one ticket shall the property of the court o embrace the names of all county officers voted for, including office of senator, member, and MORE members of assembly, if voted for, and members of congress, if voted for, and he labelled, "county;" one ticket shall embrace the names of all township officers voted for, and be labelled, "township;" one ticket shall embrace the names of all borough officers voted for, and be labelled, "borough;" and each class shall be deposited in separate ballot-boxes.

Also, in accordance with the provisions of the 8th section of an act entitled "A further supplement to the Election Laws of this Com-monwealth," I publish the following:


