Election Proolamation.

PURSUANT to an Act of the General As-PURSUANT to an Act of the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania; entitled "An Aut refating to the Elections of this Commonwealth," approved the second day of July, A. D. one thousand eight hundred and thirty-nine, I, W. W. BROWN, Sheriff of the county of Potter, Pennsylvania, do hereby make known and give notice to the electors of the county aforesaid, that a General-Election will be held in the said county of Potter on the Second Tuesday (Ninth) of Cotober, 1806, at which time District and Cotober, 1866, at which time District and County Officers, as follows, are to be elected,

One person for Governor of the Common-wealth of Pennsylvania.
One person for Member of Congress, for the XVIII Congressional District, comprising the

counties of Centre, Clinton, Lycoming, Tioga and Potter. Two persons for Members of the House of Representatives of the General Assembly of Pennsylvania, in conjunction with the county of Tioga to represent the counties of Tioga

Two persons for Associate Judges of the county of Potter.

For the township of Sweden, at the house am arrected, that every peson excepting Jus-tices of the Peace, who hold any office or appointment or profit or trust under the Gov-ernment of the United States or this State, or of any city or incorporoted district, whether a commissioned officer or otherwise a suborriunte officer or agent, who is or shall be em-pioyed under the legislative, judiciary, or executive departments of this State or the United States, or of any city or incorporated district and also that every Memper of Congress and of the State Legislature, and of the select and common council of any city, or commissioner of any incorporated district, is by law incapable of holding or exercising at the same time of Stephen Horton, in said township.

Also, that in the 1st section of an Act of Assembly entitled "An Act Regulating the mode of voting at all Elections in the several counties of this Commonwealth," approved March 30th, 1866, it is enacted: That the qualified voters of the several counties of this commonwealth, at all general, township borough and special elections, are hereby, hereafter, authorized and required to vote, by tickets, printed, or written, or partly printed and partly written, severally classified as follows: One ticket shall embrace the names of all Judges of courts voted for, and to be la-belled, outside, "judiciary;" one ticket shall embarce the names of all state officers voted for, and be labelled, "state;" one ticket shall embrace the names of all county officers voted for, including office of senator, member, and more DURABLE, members of assembly, if voted for, and members of congress, if voted for, and be labelled, "county;" one ticket shall embrace the names of all township officers voted for, and be labelled, better than any other Skirt. belled, "township;" one ticket shall embrace the names of all berough officers voted for, and be labelled, "berough;" and each class

shall be deposited in separate ballot-boxes. Also, in accordance with the provisions of the 8th section of an act entitled "A further supplement to the Election Laws of this Com-monwealth," I publish the following:

WHEREAS, By the act of the Congress of the United States, entitled "An act to amend the several acts heretofore passed to provide for the enrolling and calling out the rational forces, and for other purposes," and approved March 3d, 1865, all jersons who have descried the military or naval service of the United Stokes, and who have not been discharged or relieved from the penalty or disability therein provided, are deemed to have voluntarily relieved and ferfeited their rights of citizens thereof:

and are deprived of exercising any rights of citizens thereof:

A FAVORIVE SKIRT.

And Whereas, Persons not citizens of the United States are not, under the constitution and laws of Pennsylvania, qualified electors of this Commonwealth:

Section 1. Beit enacted, &c,. That in all elections hereafter to be held in this Common-wealth, it shall be unlawful for the judges or inspectors of any such election to receive any ballot or ballots from any person or persons embraced in the provisions and subject to the disability imposed by said act of Congress, approved March 3d, 1865, and it shall be unlawful for any such person to offer to vote

any ballot or ballots. Section 2. That if any such judge and inspectors of election, or any of them shall receive or consent to receive any such unlawful ballot or ballots from any such disqualified person, he or they so offending shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof in any court of quarter sessions of this commonwealth, he shall, for each offence, be sentenced to pay a fine of not less than one hundred dollars, and to undergo an imprisonment in the jail of the proper county for not

less than sixty days.
Section 3. That if any person deprived of citizenship, and disquiffed as aforesaid, shall, at any election hereafter to be held in this and substantial EAVES-TROUGHS put up in commonwealth, vote, or tender to the officers thereof, and ofier to vote, a ballot or ballots, any person so offending shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and on conviction thereof in any court of quarter sessions of this commonwealth, shall for each of cuse be pun-ished in like manner as provided in the pre-ceding section or this act in the case of officers of election receiving such unlawful ballot or

hallots -SECTION 4. That of any person shall hereafter persuade or advise any person or per sons deprived of citizenship and disqualified as aforesaid, to offer any ballot or ballots to the officers of any election hereafter to be hold in this commonwealth, such persons so offending shall be guilty of a misdemeaner, and

upon conviction three of in any court of quar-ter sessions of this commonwealth, shall be punished in like manner as is provided in the second section of this act, in the case of off-

cers of such election receiving such unlawful It is further directed that the meeting of the return Judges at the Court House in Couders-port to make out the general returns, shall be the first Friday, succeeding the general elec-tion, which will be the 12th day of October.


