

Mr. Greeley's Portrait—By Himself.

Mr. Greeley's campaign speeches are the most remarkable productions which our political history has seen. Even the wonderings of Andrew Johnson, and the records thereof by Mr. Petrosone V. Masby, furnish nothing which, for show and ostentatious folly, can equal this series of wise-but-folly. POLITICAL NOTES.

Mr. Charles O'Connor has not consented to accept the nomination for Governor of the State. He has declined to do so, and has given up the idea of running for Governor.

Official returns from nearly all the towns of Maine show that in the recent election the vote for Mr. Greeley was 71,500, and for Mr. Fremont 17,100, an increase of between 600 to 1,000 over the majority of last year, and a little more than double the average Republican majority in the Congressional elections of the last three years.

A letter from a gentleman in Dauphin county says that "if the election were to come off to-morrow, General Hartranft would be elected by 20,000." Dauphin county, he says, will give him 2,000 a larger majority than York county gave to Mr. Greeley.

Complete official returns from the Congressional districts of Maine show the following Republican majorities: First District, 2165; Second, 4377; Third, 2040; Fourth, 2128; Fifth, 2041. The Third District is special.

A grand Democratic parade in Boston, the other night, after two weeks preparation, numbered just sixty-eight individuals, officers and all. They are evidently not much enthused in that locality.

In Berks the Reading *Journal* is positive that General Hartranft will receive every Grant vote, and that he will have the heaviest Republican vote ever cast for Governor in the county. In Dauphin the soldier candidate for Governor will receive a like vote.

It is reported that Mr. George Law, the well-known Democrat and millionaire, is earnestly in favor of the re-election of President Grant.

A Philadelphia correspondent of the New York *Times* says that the managers of the *Morning Post* have made a mistake in the Grant leaders, who are the backbone of the Greeley campaign is a complete failure.

The Springfield *Republican*, in view of the tide of public feeling is now setting against the candidates, and that their chance of success will depend upon the introduction of some new element into the campaign, or upon some turn of affairs which shall do as much for them as the last five weeks have done for their opponents.
