HARRISBURG, March 12, 1886.
Dear Sir:—I desire through your paper to reply
to numerous citizens of Tioga county, who
remorsefully regret the passing of the bill
authorizing the poor house, reached me yesterday.

At the bill authorizing the poor house, passed the
Senate on the 11th day of March, and has now become a
law, the remonstrances came too late for any purpose
except to underscore to the annuity of the people of
Tioga on the question of the best way of caring for their
poor.

The bill which has now become a law, was introduced
into the House by Dr. Humphrey, who, as the immediate
representative of Tioga, must regard as the true
equivalent of public sentiment in that county, passed
that body and came to the Senate for its action. Here
