A rival of a certain great lawyer sought to humiliate him publicly, by saying: "You blacked my father's boots once." "Yes," replied the lawyer, unabashed, "and I did it well." And because of doing mean things well, he rose to greatness.
Take heart, all who toil! all youths in humble situations, all in adverse circumstances, and those who labor unappreciated. If it be but to drive the plow, strive to do it well! If only to cut bolts, make good ones; or to blow the bellows, keep the iron hot. It is attention to business that lifts the feet higher up on the ladder.
Says the good book, "Seest thou a man diligent in his business, he shall stand before kings; he shall not stand before mean men."

It makes the upper shed as the beaten comes forward, and beats up the filling after the cross is made, making better cloth and better savings than can be made in any other way.

It is the only hand loom that is suitable for weaving wool, as no loom that makes all the shed as the beaten goes back, will beat wool satisfactorily. It has no strings to stretch and get out of order; has treadles at both sides of the loom, making the shed for the foot, and the hand. This loom is made to weave the different kinds of cloth, by simply changing the plan that make the up.
