In the year 1847 a family named Pringle, consisting of husband and wife, two sons and four daughters, became converted to Mormonism, and started from their old home in Oneida county, New York, for Salt Lake City. When the late civil war broke out, he joined the rebel army, and became one of the most skillful scouts in Beauregard's command.
